 - Introducing accredited installer schemes

 - Promoting the new ACRIB skillcard for RAC operatives.



Collective action

Energy and Environment are fundamental issues addressed across FETA in its associations and groups, but also in concert with similar organisations within the building services sector, and in European bodies to which it is affiliated.

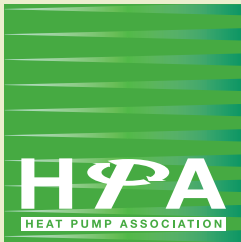
Together, we have:

- Promoted the new Carbon Trust Implementation service for carbon savings
- Aided DECC with the MCS Certification Scheme for Microgeneration technologies
- Assisted DEFRA to develop a national position on revising the European F Gas Regulation
- Drafted an ISO standard on fan efficiency standards to match the European Directive on Energy Using Products
- Published a report to support sustainability in building services via integrated project teams
- Participated in DCLG working groups to revise Part L of the Building Regulations for 2013
- Developed a national CO₂ refrigeration qualification.
